In 2025, the festival is on Wednesday, November 5, with celebrations often beginning the day before with processions called Nagar Kirtan.

Guru Nanak was born on April 15, 1469, in Talwandi, which is now Nankana Sahib, Pakistan.

The festival commemorates his birth and celebrates his teachings of equality, honesty, selfless service, and devotion to one God.

His teachings emphasize that the spiritual and everyday lives are interconnected, and that a truthful, honest, and practical life is a higher form of truth.
